This story includes words that end with /ch/.


The witch goes to the beach.

The witch also made a sandwich. "I will take this sandwich to the beach with me, then I won't have to buy my lunch at the beach," she thought.




Then, the witch started off on her walk to the beach. She walked past the church. The church bells were ringing and they were very loud.



Next, the witch walked past someone who was reading a speech. "How strange," she thought and she carried on walking.





Soon, the witch could see the beach and the sea in the distance. "I can't wait for my feet to touch the sand," she thought.






