**park.**

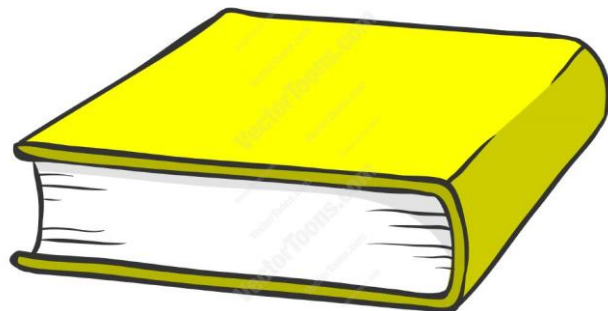

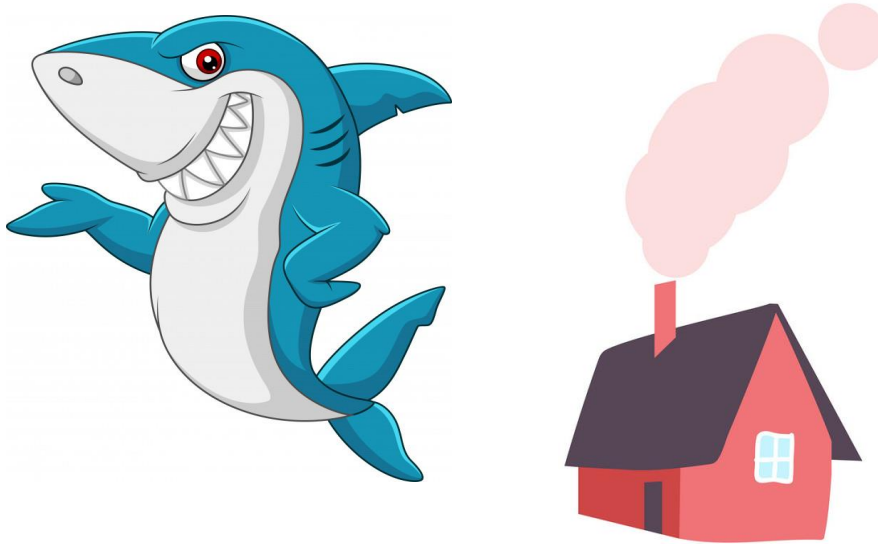
“The **park** is my favourite place!” said the **shark**. The **shark** and the **duck** spent hours at the **park** but then, it was time for them to go **back** home.



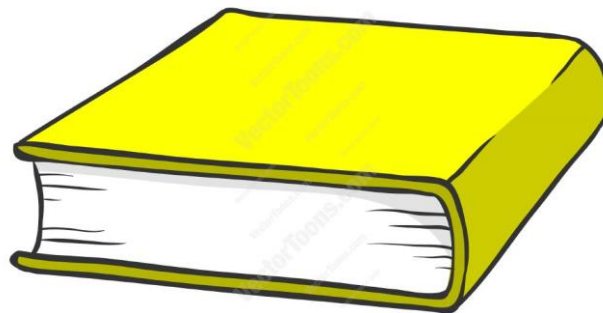

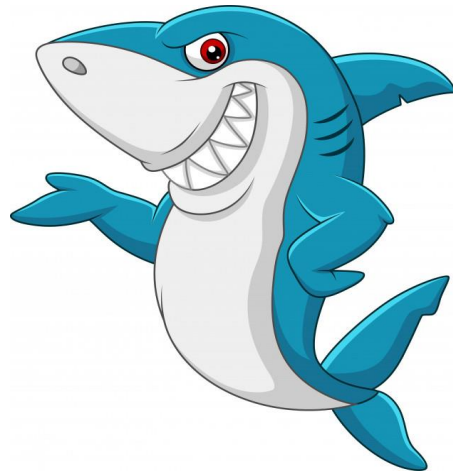
The **shark** looked out of his window and could see some **smoke**. “Someone must be having a bonfire,” he thought.
