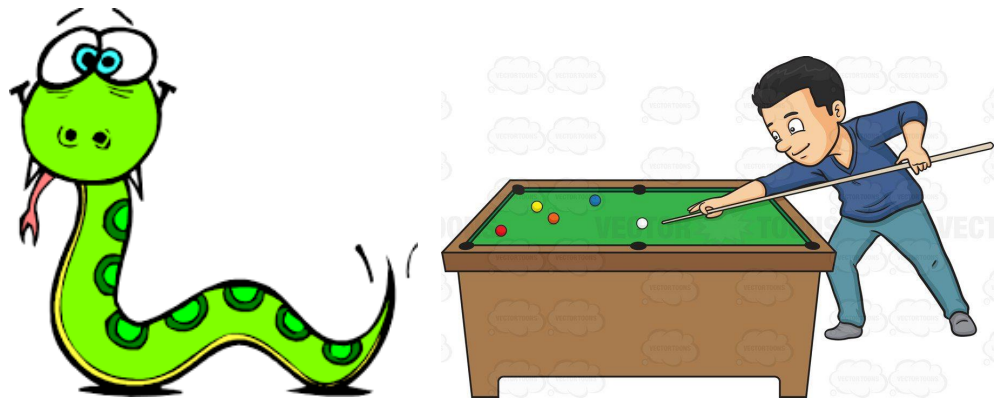


The snake plays snooker.

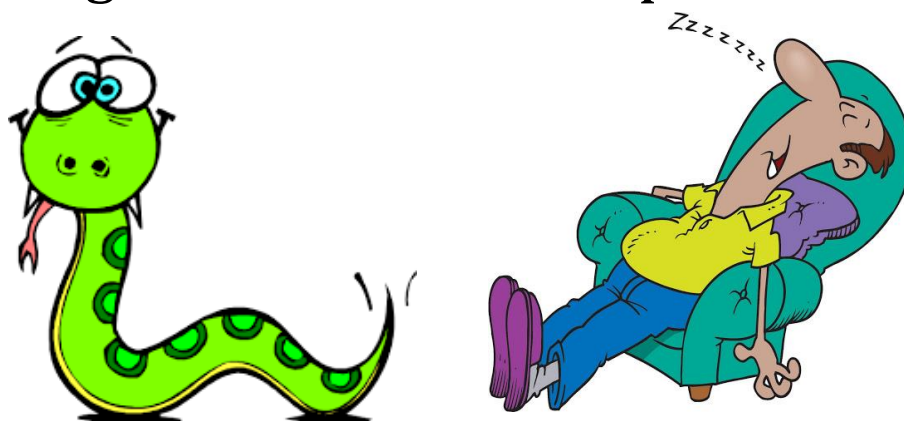

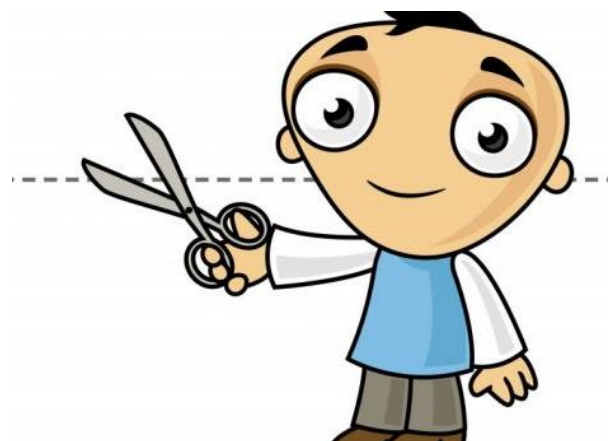

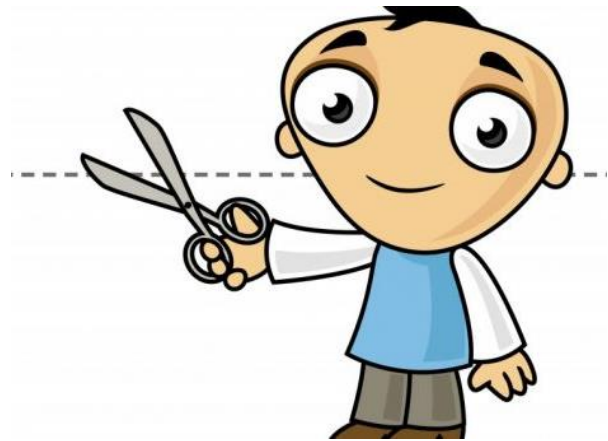
