


The dinosaur and the piano.



The dinosaur and the piano.


The dinosaur woke up early because he was so excited about his birthday. It was a lovely sunny day. “What a lovely day for a birthday!” he thought.





The dinosaur was very hungry so he had some breakfast. He had some banana and some honey. “Yummy!” he said to himself.




